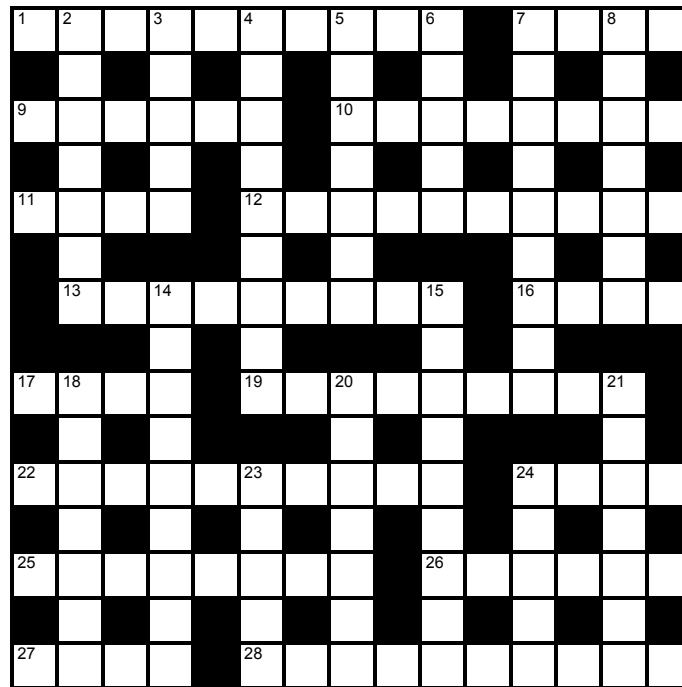


# A Well-Known Pair
